If you charge it from a wall outlet using a 100W charger, it would theoretically take 5 hours to fully charge (500Wh \div 100W = 5 hours). But considering the charging efficiency, it may take around 5.5 - 6 hours.

Charging time depends on the battery capacity and the input method. Smaller power stations with 300Wh capacity may charge in 2-4 hours using a wall outlet, while larger 1,000Wh+ ...

Depending on the power station's capacity and the charging speed, it may take anywhere from a few hours to a full day to reach a complete charge. Car Charging: For those who need to ...
